They say a picture is worth a thousand words – how will you convey yours?

There are 4 categories:

Best landscape photograph: Photographs should capture the interconnected nature of our islands' surrounding landscape, explaining the world beneath our feet in one shot.

Best environmental story photograph: Photographs should provide visual representation of the environmental issues our islands are facing. Photographs should tell a powerful impactful story that grips viewers and raises questions.

Best wildlife photograph: Photographs should focus on iconic species to Uist and Barra and/or endangered species, expressing the character and journey of that species.

Best wildlife photograph (for those under 16): Photographs should focus on iconic species to Uist and Barra and/or endangered species, expressing the character and journey of that species through a young islander's eyes.

Photographs should be submitted to nudc@isleofnorthuist.com by Monday the 31st of May at 23:59, and should have a minimum resolution of 1600 x 1200 pixels.
